Unfortunately seven men were died in these long queues due to their physical weakness. Three little words, Gota Go home became Sri Lanka's new national mantra. The young, the old, the poor, the rich, people of all genders, races and faiths all got together to rally as one to answer the nation's cry. They joined any protest they could find, bringing with them their handwritten placards all bearing the common message demanding the resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and the Government.

The March 31st demonstration at the Presidents' private residence spread people's power across the country and across the oceans.
